Situational Status Report

Community Overdose Action Team (COAT)

1. Situation to date

- Per the Montgomery County Coroner's Office, there were **566** accidental overdose deaths for calendar year 2017.
- Per the Montgomery County Coroner's Office, there were **294** accidental overdose deaths for calendar year 2018.
- This is a 48% drop in accidental deaths from 2017 to 2018.
- Casey Smith started as the Community Overdose Action Team Project Manager during this operational period and will be leading the Operations Section.
