Community Overdose Action Team (COAT)

1. Situation to date

- Per the Montgomery County Coroner's Office, there were **562** accidental overdose deaths for calendar year 2017.
- Per the Montgomery County Coroner's Office, there have been 47 accidental overdose deaths as of March 1, 2018.
- An annual COAT Progress report will be completed in this month.
- An annual COAT Data Report will be completed this month
- The mobile syringe unit will arrive March 22nd and be available for use starting in April 2018.
- Monthly Media Briefings are scheduled with the Joint Information Center. The March briefing was canceled due to Health and Human Services, Secretary Alex Azar's visit to Montgomery County.
