



COVID-19 Weekly Summary Montgomery County, As of 9/10/2021

Current COVID-19 Cases – symptom onset within the last 21 days:

- In the last week, current COVID-19 cases **increased** (by 15%) from 4,244 to 4,880
- Blacks have the highest current case rate (**671.6 per 100,000**) followed by Whites (**603.7**)
- Whites have the highest current case count (**2,382**) followed by Blacks (**812**).
- Individuals 15 to 18yrs have the highest current case rate (**1,631.8 per 100,000**)

Overall COVID-19 Cases:

- The average daily COVID-19 case count during September (**281/day**) is nearly **1.5 times higher** than the average daily case count in August (**202/day**)
- The number of reported COVID-19 cases **decreased** (by 34%) from last week (2,239) to this week (1,486)
- There are **181** reported COVID-19 hospital admissions through September 10th, there were **495** hospitalizations in August
- There are **3** reported COVID-19 deaths through September 10th, there were **39** deaths in August

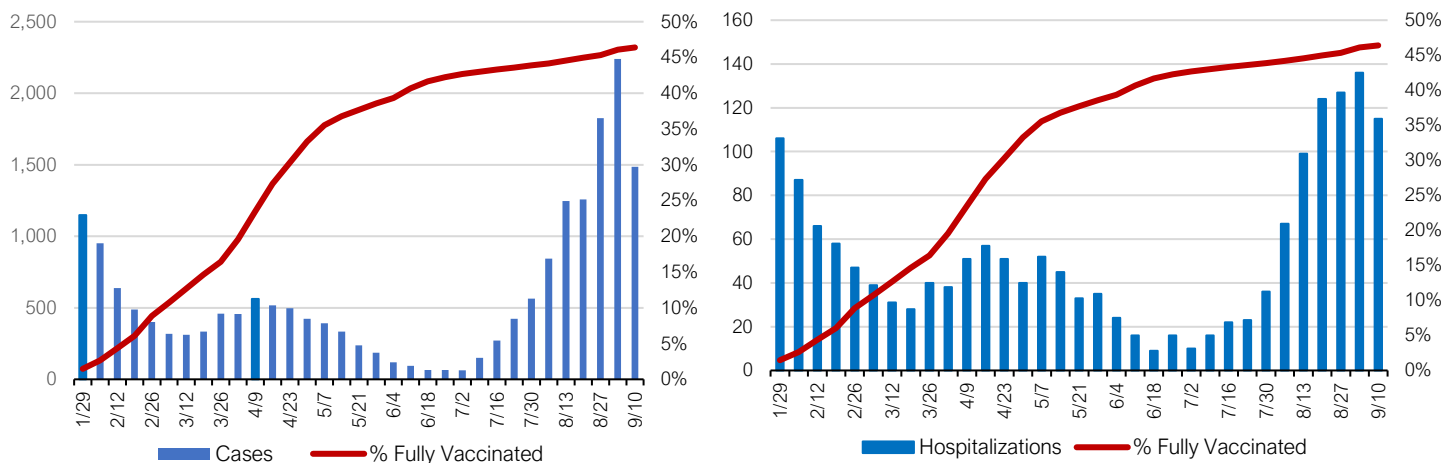

Figure 1. Weekly COVID-19 Cases, Hospitalizations and % Fully Vaccinated, Montgomery, as of 9/10/2021*

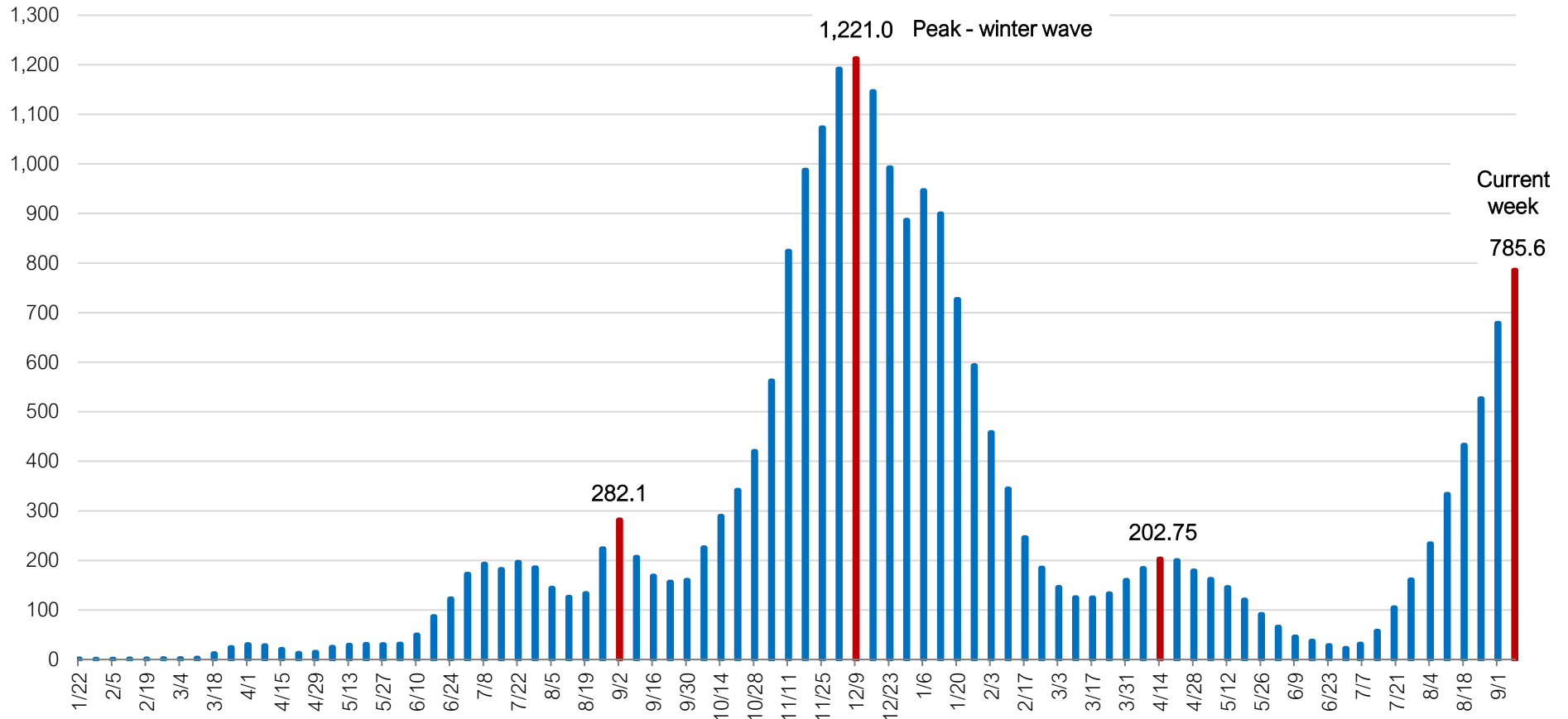

Overall COVID-19 Case Rate:

- Hispanics (9,903.0) and Blacks (9,826.3) have the **highest** overall COVID-19 case rates
- The two-week incident rate of cases **increased** (by 16%) from 678.4 per 100,000 last week to 785.6
- The two-week incident rate of cases continues to **increase** each week and is the **highest** since January 2021
- Compared to this time last year, the current 2-week incident rate of cases is nearly **4 times higher** (206.5 compared to 785.6)

Figure 2. Two-Week COVID-19 Case Rate per 100,000 Residents, Montgomery, As of 9/10/2021

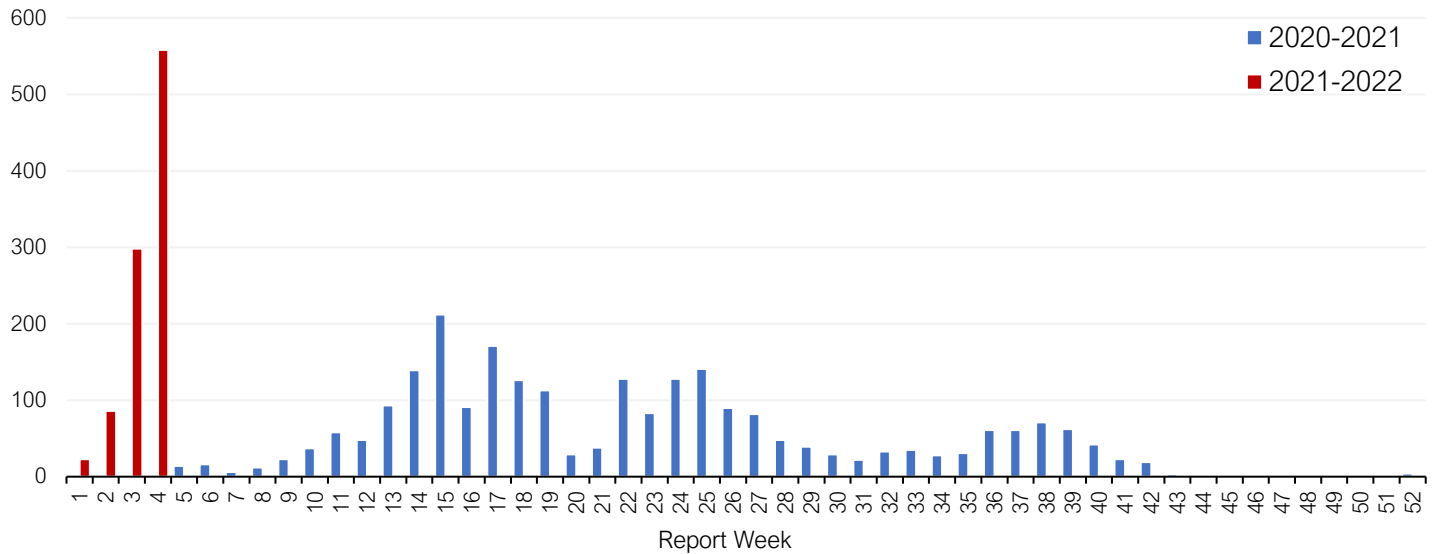

K-12 School Cases:

- Montgomery County had a total of **2,741** COVID-19 cases for the 2020/2021 school year – students accounted for most cases (1,755 students, 986 staff)
- There were **558** cases reported in the last week (499 students, 120 staff) – an **87% increase** from the week prior (86 cases)
- There are **965** total cases reported for the 2021/2022 school year

Figure 3. K-12 COVID-19 Cases by Report Week and School Year, as of 9/7/2021

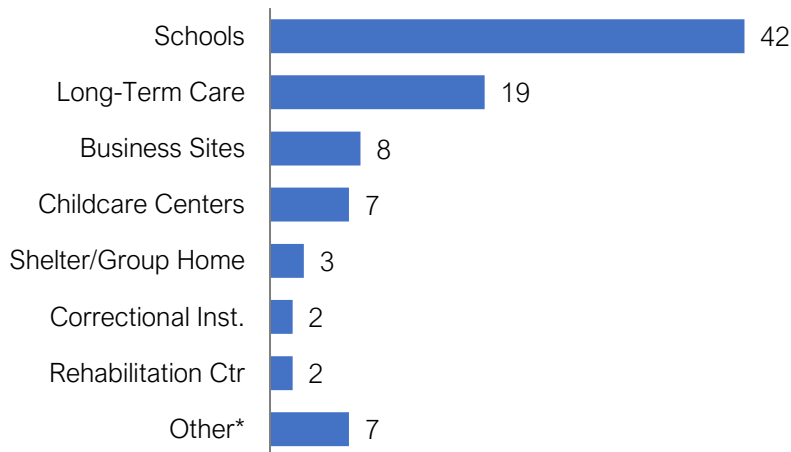


Note: Reporting for K-12 COVID-19 cases began during report week 5 (9/7/2020) for the 2020/2021 school year; therefore, case counts are unavailable for report weeks 1-4.

COVID-19 Outbreaks:

- Montgomery County has had **368** COVID-19 outbreaks with **11,243** confirmed and probable cases
- Outbreak cases account for **17%** of all Montgomery County COVID-19 cases (of 63,048)
- Most outbreaks (**23%** or **84**) occurred within long-term care facilities and schools (K-12 or College/Universities) (**23%** or **83**)
- Montgomery County has **90** active confirmed/probable COVID-19 outbreak investigations open
